The final practicum requires the students to produce a three song demo using skills learned during the program.

Overview

Media Arts Production is a program of study that introduces the student to a variety of digital media and animation skills and opens the door to career opportunities in a range of media and broadcast fields. Students may also use this program as a general springboard to more in-depth study in the areas of film, television, photography, animation or video or audio production.

Did You Know?

Media Arts graduates may employ their skills in over fifty media related specialties in photography, film, audio, animation and video recording.

Careers in Animation

The animation industry is rapidly moving away from traditional cell based animation. The use of tools like Macromedia Flash has overtaken traditional ink and paint type animation positions. Employees in this industry are less likely to find positions that require a linear set of skills. More in demand today are employees who understand the entire animation process including final composition and editing of both audio and video elements.

Careers in Audio & Video

Television and film production careers are available to quali-

fied individuals with the proper training. An understanding of composition, videography and digital technologies provides a solid background for those in the video industry. Employers have entry level positions as camera operators and assistants, lighting assistants and video editors and engineering assistants. These opening positions are the stepping-stones to jobs with increased responsibility and rewards.

There is an increasing appetite for video media in the marketplace. Broadcasters, local cable companies and independent video producers are all taking advantage of new technologies to make production easier, cost efficient and available.

Careers in Photography and Imaging

The Media Arts Program provides introductory digital imaging skills that would qualify someone to work in a photographic studio or processing lab as an image editor. Most professional photographers are now employing people in house to do jobs that used to be outsourced to big labs.

Digital technology has also been adopted by small to medium photo processing labs, again employing people for these positions that would once have been only available in larger professional labs in larger centers. Photographers are also experimenting with new products such as DVD slide shows and presentations that use their current photographic material. Media Arts students are ideally trained to assist them with preparing for the convergence of media in this area.

Medical Transcription

Program Length
32 weeks, full time

Overview

The Medical Transcription Program is eight months in duration and is designed to respond to the need for highly skilled transcriptionists for the medical field. Medical Transcription is a field that requires employees provide quick and accurate service for their employers and contractors.

The program includes these major areas of instruction: medical anatomy, medical terminology, accurate and timely transcription, proficient proof-reading, editing skills, technical and computer skills.

A medical transcriptionist works with medical reports, correspondence, records, patient-care information, statistics, medical research and administrative material. Transcriptionists are required to be highly accurate in the process of working with these documents. In order to be effective they require an excellent working knowledge of terminology and the context of the subject being transcribed.

Effective transcriptionists must have comprehensive medical knowledge and use sound judgment to think through a case in order to detect problems. A well trained transcriptionist can spot errors in a report and check back with the doctor and associated reference material to get the right information.

Career Opportunities

Medical transcription is an



industry that is exploding. It is prestigious and in demand across the United States and Canada. According to the US Department of Labor, "Employment of medical transcriptionists is projected to grow faster than the average for all occupations through 2010. Demand for medical transcription services will be spurred by a growing and aging population."

Program Overview

The Bookkeeping Program is designed to respond to the need for highly skilled bookkeepers in a modern business office. Running a professional business office requires skilled employees who provide efficient and accurate financial record keeping.

Bookkeeping is the recording of day-to-day financial transactions which include sales, purchase, income and payments by an individual or organization.

Bookkeeping should not be confused with accounting. The accounting process is usually performed by an accountant who creates reports from the financial transactions recorded by the bookkeeper. Any process that involves the recording of financial transactions is a bookkeeping process.

Career Opportunities

According to Service Canada, careers as bookkeepers are expected to remain steady with good opportunities for self-employment. In Canada, Bookkeepers make, on average, \$15.00 per hour, with the high end of the wage scale being \$28.00 per hour and remuneration increases as experience is gained. Experienced bookkeepers can make between \$50- and \$58-thousand dollars per year. Bookkeepers are employed in most business situations in a wide variety of industries, including retail, professional services, manufacturing and service industries. You will find



bookkeepers working for employers such as doctors or lawyers, shipping companies, clothing retailers and building contractors. Wherever there are business transactions to record, you will find bookkeepers employed.

Overview

Photography is currently undergoing a dramatic revolution as we move from a silver-halide to a digital based imaging medium. Digitization has reinvigorated the photographic profession and created new opportunities for those prepared to take advantage of the new realities of digital imaging in this profession.

Digital Photography is a comprehensive study of commercial photographic skills required by working photographers and explicitly addresses new technology that has changed forever how professionals work in the field.

The program has the following educational objectives:

1) Provide training for students using newly available digital SLR's. 2) Instruct students on how to use digital image editing software, including Adobe Photoshop. 3) Teach students how to properly choose, compose and produce commercially successful scenic, portrait and event photographs. 4) Teach students important business and promotional skills required to become successful commercial and studio photographers.



Career Opportunities

Sixty-two percent of photographers in Canada are self-em-



ployed. These people most often work as freelance and commercial photographers in private studios promoting services such as portrait, wedding, group and event coverage.

Many people also work as photographers in addition to other full or part time employment. Seasonal portrait and event work is readily available to talented individuals. Many professional photographers employ assistants to process, store, catalog, proof and print digital images. These assistants have become more common now that services once performed by the photo lab are performed digitally, in-house.

A number of career options are available to our students upon graduating from the Digital Photography program:

1) Become self-employed as a professional freelance or studio photographer. 2) Become a

photographer's assistant, helping with both photographic shooting and post processing tasks for a commercial studio. 3) Seek employment as a photojournalist or other salaried photographic positions. 4) Be employed as a lab-tech correcting, processing and printing digital images for a commercial lab.

Heavy Equipment Operator

Program Length
10 weeks, full time

Overview

The McKenzie College Heavy Equipment Operator Program is designed to provide students with the essential skills needed to operate the four main pieces of heavy equipment used on a commercial worksite; Backhoe, Bulldozer, Excavator, and Front End Loader. Heavy equipment operation is a job that is in good demand in Nova Scotia and Across the country, specifically the oils sand development in Alberta. Despite growth and demand in this area of employment, there are no institutions offering this program in the CBRM area.

Career Opportunities

Heavy Equipment Operators move construction materials such as dirt, rocks and heavy materials often found in construction sites, road work, demolition and oil and gas production. Equipment such as bulldozers, backhoe's, excavators and front end loaders are among the most commonly used equipment on a construction site. Essential on almost any construction job site, the number of different machines for various applications is large enough that heavy equipment jobs are almost always available.

What makes our program unique?

The McKenzie College Heavy Equipment Operation program is the only program available in the industrial Area of Cape Breton. We offer a 10-week program that includes extensive worksite experience and hands on training.



This program is ideal for students who have an interest in working in the local construction industry or the oil and gas industry in Alberta.

Course Management

Students log in securely to our student and course management system. Here they are provided with all the elements of their education in one convenient site. Students can download lessons, receive personal instructor attention, upload assignments and take tests. The student management site provides students with the structure they need and the flexibility they want.

Instructors, Testing and Assignments

Lessons are structured around traditional texts, hands on assignments, instructor evaluation and compre-

What if I already own a digital SLR camera or software?

Some students already own a compatible SLR system and software and do not require the equipment included in the program. If this is the case, you can request a deduction in the tuition and significantly reduce the cost of your program. Please inquire with the registrar for specific details.



What equipment will I receive as part of my Journalism and Professional Writing program?

All the equipment you need to begin your program is included in the cost of tuition for the Journalism and Professional Writing program.

As part of your program you will receive a Windows compatible laptop and digital voice recorder. You will also receive a full version of Microsoft Windows, the profes-

sional software tool of choice for virtually all writing professionals. The use of all this equipment is included in the tuition cost of the Journalism and Professional Writing program for the duration of your course. The equipment is yours to keep upon successful completion of the program.

Online Training F.A.Q. (frequently asked questions)

What do you need to get started?

Getting started in an online training program is easy. Start by completing the enclosed application form, and be sure to include the requested supporting documentation.

Once we receive your application we will review it and begin your registration process. An admissions officer will contact you to review your financing options and help you apply for student assistance should you require it.

Once you've been accepted, we will review your learning timetable and schedule a start date for your personal program to begin. With our help, a great new career may be closer than you think.

When can I start?

You can start at any time. McKenzie College offers continuous intake service so that you can start your program when your schedule allows.

What prior training do I need?

Grade 12 or equivalent is a prerequisite for our online and in class programs.

How soon can I start earning?

Students of online learning programs can start earning money from freelance work after just a few months of study. To help you get started, the Career Planning module is designed to get you started earning money from your new skills.

Must I quit my job?

Not necessarily. You can take your online training within a timetable that accommodates your lifestyle and at your own pace.

Is the course difficult?

Our online programs are challenging and give you lots of hands-on practice. We ask for a commitment of 20-25 hours of work a week from our students enrolled in full time programs. Our online programs are both challenging and enjoyable.

How long is the Course?

Your course is designed as a full-time program intended to be delivered over 10 months. Part time students

may arrange a longer schedule to complete their program. You proceed at your own pace. There is no extra charge for an extension to the course schedule.

What if I am not completely satisfied with my program?

Students enrolled in our online programs enjoy a 21-day money back guarantee. After 21 days of study, students may discontinue their program at any time and receive a pro-rated refund for the unused portion of the program.



Do I need expensive equipment?

Yes, and we provide it for you in the cost of the tuition in a full time program. Upon your successful graduation you may choose to keep the equipment.

What if I already have my own equipment?

If you currently own equipment suitable for completing your program you will be able to request a reduction in the cost of your program, if you do not require the supplied materials, software or equipment.

Is financial assistance available?

McKenzie College is a registered Private Career College under the Private Career Colleges Regulations Act. Students may qualify for financial assistance through local student financial assistance programs. You must contact your local student aid office to find out whether you qualify.

Is there any federal or provincial tax on the fees?

There is no federal or provincial tax on full time programs. Professional development modules are subject to federal and provincial tax.

Is the course eligible for an Income Tax deduction?

Full time courses are tax deductible.

Do I need Internet access?

Yes. High speed DSL or Cable is preferable.

How will I get feedback on my progress?

You receive personal evaluation for all assignments and projects from an experienced McKenzie College Instructor. Online tests are automatically graded by our course management system and you receive your results immediately.

What kind of diploma will I receive?

All McKenzie College programs are registered with the NS Department of Education, and recognised by the National Student Loan Services Center and National Association of Career Colleges. Upon the successful completion of your program you will receive a diploma confirming that you are a graduate of a nationally recognized program registered in the Province of Nova Scotia.

Financial Options

Student Loan

Students completing full-time programs of study may apply for assistance through the Canada Student Loan Program. Student Loan recipients may receive funding for tuition, books, supplies and in some cases living expenses. Canada Student Loan recipients enjoy a six month payment-free period after their studies are complete. Assistance with applying for Canada Student Loan is available through the College. Please allow six to eight weeks for processing of student loan documents.

Student Line of Credit

Some students may be eligible for financial assistance from their current bank in the form of a student line of credit. In this case a reduced interest period may be available with reasonable repayment terms that will allow you to finance your education. Our registrar will be happy to help you contact your financial institution for specific terms and options.

Monthly Payment

Students who wish to complete programs of study, but who are not applying for or who do not qualify for Canada Student Loan assistance may choose to make monthly tuition payments to the College. A personal payment schedule may be arranged with the College financial office.

Visa and Mastercard

Payments may be made using your credit card. For your convenience tuition payments may be spread over the duration of your program

Paypal

Online payments may be made conveniently through Paypal, the world leading online payment and transaction service.

Student Study Grant

Some students may be eligible for a non-repayable student study grant. Eligibility for study grants are determined by your provincial Student Loan office.

Federal Employment Assistance and Training Allowance Programs

Some students may be eligible for financial assistance and a training allowance from HRDC and Skills Development Canada. If you have been in receipt of benefits or are a member of a group or minority that is eligible, funding assistance may be available. Our office can help you determine your potential eligibility and assist you in contacting your HRDC and Skills Canada office.

Canada Pension

Some students may be eligible to collect pension benefits while attending College or University. If you are the child of a deceased parent and are under the age of 25 you may be eligible for a non-repayable monthly benefit. Our registrars office can assist you in applying for pension benefits.

Part Time Students

Students may also choose to enroll in individual modules of some programs. Selected modules of many of our programs are available to the public as continuing education and professional development courses. A variety of payment methods are available for part time students.

Tax Benefits

McKenzie College programs are registered education programs with the Nova Scotia Department of Education. There may be tax benefits available to you as an individual or as a business owner, depending on your personal tax situation.

As an accredited program of study, tuition costs may be deducted. Students may also have the ability to assign their tax credit to a parent if it is not financially beneficial for them to use the credit themselves directly.



Canada Student Loans Program

The Canada Student Loans Program aids students in financing their education. The Canada Student Loans Program is available for students who are either full time and part time. This program also incorporates the Canada Study Grants which fund qualified students including: students with disabilities, students with dependants, high-need part-time students, and women in certain fields of doctoral studies.

If you are a full-time student, or you are planning to become one, you may qualify for a subsidized loan through the Canada Student Loans Program. While you pursue your studies the Canadian Government pays the interest that accumulates on your loan to the lender. You do not have to make any payments on a Canada Student Loan while you are in school full-time. After you have finished your full time studies, interest on your loan starts to build up though you are not required to start paying it until 6 months after that. This is the grace period and after it is over you are required to pay the interest and the principal. If you are having difficulty managing and repaying your loans after you have finished your studies you may be eligible for interest relief and in some cases, debt reduction.

Full Time Students

Eligibility for the Canada Student Loans Program

To be eligible for a full-time Canada Student Loan, you must fulfill all of the following:

1) be a Canadian citizen or per-

manent resident of Canada;
2) be a resident of a province or territory that participates in the Canada Student Loans Program. Quebec and the Northwest Territories do not participate since they administer their own loan programs;

3) You must be able to demonstrate to the provincial or territorial student assistance office through the completion of an application form, that you cannot monetarily cover your educational costs;

4) enroll or be qualified to enroll in at least 60 percent of a full-time course load at a designated post-secondary educational institution;

5) students with permanent disabilities may enroll in 40 percent of a full-time course load; and

6) enroll, or be qualified to enroll, in a program leading to a degree, diploma or certificate. (The program must be at least 12 weeks in length within a period of 15 consecutive weeks.)

Amount You Can Borrow

You can borrow, depending on your financial need up to a maximum of \$165.00 for each week of your study period. This is the maximum you can borrow from the Canada student Loan program but you might also be eligible from your Provincials loan programs or through other scholarships and bursaries

How to apply

Go to your educational institution or the provincial or territorial student assistance office nearest you.

Depending on the province or territory in which you live, you may be asked to submit your application directly to either your post-secondary institution or to the student assistance office.

Financial aid offices at most colleges and universities, as well as admissions offices at private and provincial schools, also have information materials and application forms for the Canada Student Loans Program.

Canada Study Grants

These grants which are administered by the governments are available to provide assistance to students with permanent disabilities, high-need part-time students, and women in certain doctoral studies as well as help full and part-time student loan recipients with dependants finance their education. These are different from student loans, since Canada Study Grants do not have to be repaid.

Students with Disabilities

If you have a permanent disability such as deafness, blindness, other physical or learning disabilities, you may be eligible for a Canada Study Grant of up to \$5,000 a year to cover exceptional education-related costs associated with your disability. To be eligible, you must:

- 1) Have a permanent disability which limits your ability to participate fully in post-secondary studies or in the labour force (proof required);
- 2) If you are applying as a full-time student, you must be

enrolled in courses that represent at least 40 percent of a full-time course load.

3) If you are applying as a part-time student, you must be enrolled in courses representing at least 20 percent of a full-time course load.

The grant may cover such exceptional expenses as the costs of a tutor, an interpreter, attendant care, or special equipment. To apply, you must first complete an application for a full-time or part-time Canada Student Loan (available from your provincial or territorial student assistance office) to establish your financial needs. You then submit a separate application form for the Canada Study Grant (CSG) to the same office.

Students with Dependants

If you have children or other dependants, and can demonstrate financial need in excess of \$275 per week in combined federal and provincial loans, you may be eligible for a Canada Study Grant.

Applications may be submitted to the student assistance office in your province or territory, or online through your student assistance provincial web site.

Do I Qualify for Student Assistance

Canada Student Loans are available to Canadian residents to assist in financing education costs. Several factors influence your eligibility for assistance such as income, place of residence and marital status. You can find National Student Loan information online that may help you calculate your potential eligibility.

Complete the application form for the program and return by fax, mail or in person, along with the \$50.00 registration fee and supporting documents. Our registration office will confirm your acceptance into your program with a written letter of acceptance.

Music Demos

Music Students are requested to provide a two song demo CD or MP3 file with their application.

Music demos can not be returned so please do not send originals. Auditions may be arranged instead of providing a demo CD.

Student Loan Applicants

You can begin your application process for Student assistance immediately upon submitting your application. Most applications for student assistance are now made online. Our registration office can assist you with completing your application.

Your student loan application requires that you submit proof of income and employment where applicable. This material can be mailed or faxed to the student loan office after you complete your application online.

Once your student loan application is complete you should notify our student assistance office so that we may forward to student assistance a confirmation of your enrolment into your program along with the program start and end dates.

Loan applications take up to eight weeks, on average, to process. This time may be longer if the student assistance office is waiting for supporting documents and may also be longer during peak application periods in September. Please apply early to insure quick processing.

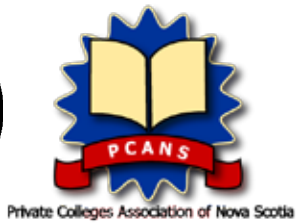
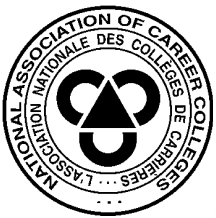
